Transportation Options for Advancing Public Philosophy Conference at the University of San Francisco, June of 2015

The conference will be held at the University of San Francisco (USF):

Please note that *USF* is **not** SFSU (San Francisco State University) or UCSF (University of California, San Francisco)

By Bus:

The conference hotel is the Parc 55 Hilton. It is 2.6 miles from the university, and is near the intersection of Powell and Market streets. Exit the hotel and walk toward the intersection of Powell and Market. Look for the bus stop on Market Street adjacent to the Gap store. Look for the sign next to the bust stop that indicates it is a stop for the 5 or 5R (rapid) bus. If you can, take the 5R. You know you're going in the right direction if the bus goes into the City and toward the Civic Center rather than toward the Bay and the Embarcadero. It is about at 30-minute ride. Ask the bus driver to call out the stop for USF. You'll need to exit the bus at Fulton Street and Parker Avenue. After exiting the bus, walk past the big church (St. Ignatius) and into campus.

The conference events will be taking place in McLaren, Kalmanovitz, and Cowell Hall. The opening plenary event will be held in McLaren. Please see the attached map.

By Cab or Ride-Share:

Well-known ride share companies, such as Uber, Lyft, Sidecar, and Flywheel, were either created or field-tested in San Francisco. All of the companies mentioned must be accessed through their smart-

phone applications work, and will quickly get you to USF. Just be sure to give them USF's address: 2130 Fulton Street. If you don't like the idea of using the ride-share services, then you can catch a cab or use the Flywheel application to digitally hail one. Using an app is recommended because getting a cab anywhere except in dense business and tourist areas is difficult. Please be aware that during the morning and afternoon rush, surge pricing may apply when using Uber.

Parking

Driving to the conference is not recommended. Parking is sparse around campus, plus on-street parking is limited to two hours. If you must drive, please see USF's guide to parking under the sub-headline "public parking:" http://www.usfca.edu/directions/parking/.

Also, here's an insider's tip: parking along panhandle park is all-day and free. There are few spots available, but if you get there early you may get a space. Also, please don't leave anything even remotely valuable in your car:
