Account of YAHUSHA warning about the Unpardonable Sin.

Healing on the Sabbath

3 And HE entered the synagogue again, and a man was there who had a withered hand.
² So they watched Him closely, whether HE would heal him on the Sabbath, so that they might [Ⓜ]accuse Him. ³ And HE said to the man who had the withered hand, [Ⓜ]“Step forward.”
⁴ Then HE said to them, “Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?” But they kept silent. ⁵ And when HE had looked around at them with anger, being grieved by the hardness of their hearts, HE said to the man, “Stretch out your hand.” And he stretched *it* out, and his hand was restored [Ⓜ]as whole as the other. ⁶ Then the Pharisees went out and immediately plotted with the Herodians against HIM, how they might destroy HIM.

A Great Multitude Follows YAHUSHA

⁷ But YAHUSHA withdrew with HIS disciples to the sea. And a great multitude from Galilee followed HIM, and from Judea ⁸ and Jerusalem and Idumea and beyond the Jordan; and those from Tyre and Sidon, a great multitude, when they heard how many things HE was doing, came to HIM. ⁹ So HE told His disciples that a small boat should be kept ready for HIM because of the multitude, lest they should crush HIM. ¹⁰ For HE healed many, so that as many as had afflictions pressed about HIM to touch HIM. ¹¹ And the unclean spirits, whenever they saw HIM, fell down before HIM and cried out, saying, “You are the Son of ELOHIYM.” ¹² But HE sternly warned them that they should not make HIM known.

The Twelve Apostles

¹³ And HE went up on the mountain and called to *HIM* those HE Himself wanted. And they came to HIM. ¹⁴ Then He appointed twelve, [Ⓜ]that they might be with HIM and that HE might send them out to preach, ¹⁵ and to have [Ⓜ]power [Ⓜ]to heal sicknesses and to cast out demons:
¹⁶ [Ⓜ]Simon, to whom HE gave the name Peter; ¹⁷ James the *son* of Zebedee and John the brother of James, to whom HE gave the name Boanerges, that is, “Sons of Thunder”;
¹⁸ Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the *son* of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Cananite; ¹⁹ and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed HIM. And they went into a house.

A House Divided Cannot Stand

²⁰ Then the multitude came together again, so that they could not so much as eat bread.

²¹ But when HIS own people heard *about this*, they went out to lay hold of HIM, for they said, “HE is out of HIS mind.”

²² And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, “HE has Beelzebub,” and, “By the ruler of the demons HE casts out demons.”

²³ So HE called them to *Himself* and said to them in parables: “How can Satan cast out Satan?

²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself, and is divided, he cannot stand, but has an end. ²⁷ No one can enter a strong man’s house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. And then he will plunder his house.

The Unpardonable Sin

²⁸ “Assuredly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the sons of men, and whatever blasphemies they may utter; ²⁹ but he who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is subject to eternal condemnation” — ³⁰ because they said, “HE has an unclean spirit.”
