PROGRAM - Assistant Governor's Visit - Temrah Okonski

It is so nice to be here. Hard to believe this is my second year as your Assistant Governor. Rotary Clubs in Howard County had a remarkable year last year, supporting 68 local organizations. Although we all felt the impact of COVID last year, there was a silver lining. We now appreciate each other even more, and we know that the world needs us more than ever.

This club does an amazing job bringing in new members. I would ask any member – why or why not would you consider talking to someone about Rotary? It's an opportunity to make the world a better place. I want to thank you for doing your part; it's one of the things that makes this club so dynamic.

What is the vision that you see for Rotary and for your club? Let's just make that happen. This club is about camaraderie. If you have an idea, bring it forward and Jim and I will help to make that a reality

Rotary is a membership organization. Everybody in this room has a responsibility to find your passion and take action. What is that piece that you want to contribute to make this club as vibrant as it is? Think about that. One thing about keeping a club vibrant is diversity. We have a way to go on this, but we should continue to be invested in this journey.

Temrah shared a video on Rotary International's action plan for this year that addresses the gap between what the organization is today, and what it needs to be. Rotary can grow and become even stronger and more effective. The RI action plan priorities are INCREASE OUR IMPACT, BE MORE DATA-DRIVEN, WELCOME MORE PEOPLE and INCREASE OUR ABILITY TO ADAPT. New ways to think, plan and take action will raise Rotary to new heights. Let's show the world what it means to be people of action.

District 7620 Governor Dr. Geetha Jayaram has four goals for this year:

(1) Support Maternal and Child Health – Howard County's clubs already are active in this. Geetha is encouraging clubs to award scholarships to women that will help to empower them.

(2) Membership – bring in new members and look at the ratio between male and female members to even out that demographic. RCCP membership is currently 43% female, with 22 females and 29 males.

(3) Marketing – to expand our reach we should "brag-market-brag." RCCP has a strong presence on social media. The Howard County clubs' joint monthly newsletter – now with 300 recipients – aims to make Rotary "the service club of choice" in the county. Monthly

community service days are planned to help push districtwide marketing. Next month's service theme will be "environment."

Mark your calendars for FallFest, Oct. 24, from 2 to 5 p.m., in Wodbine. All members – including Rotaractors – and members' families, grandchildren, Interact and prospective members are invited. We will have music, food, drinks, door prizes and time to socialize – while contributing to support polio eradication. Hope this becomes an annual event. One final comment – focus groups are being formed to help answer some basic questions. This is a goal that she initiated last year but did not get to. Will you volunteer to be in a focus group? This is only a 45–60-minute Zoom commitment. Let her know if you are willing to volunteer.

Rotary signage is needed in Columbia. A new park being built in Symphony Woods – Columbia. If the Howard County Rotary clubs commit \$5,000 we can have the first big Rotary sign in our area. She would like all-clubs participation. Stay tuned for that.

A survey for members of all clubs has been put together and e-mailed. Please participate so it can serve as food for thought.

Question: what are other clubs in the county doing now about meetings in response to COVID's continuance? She said Sunrise is meeting in person at member homes, Elkridge and Ellicott City are meeting (hybrid) at The Periodic Table, Columbia Town Center is meeting at the Wilde Lake Interfaith Center and Columbia is Zoom only. There are 167 Rotarians in the county's clubs.
